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## JOB DESCRIPTION

The Montlure Volunteer Music & Worship Leader plans, works, plays, worships, and grows with their campers as they strive to build a Christ-centered community of trust, openness, and sharing. The Montlure Volunteer Music & Worship Leader is a positive role model for each camper, one to whom the camper can look to for friendship, a listening ear, support, encouragement, understanding, and care. The Montlure Volunteer Music & Worship Leader serves with a loving attitude, and a willingness to create an atmosphere and opportunities to know Jesus Christ as they grow spiritually, physically, emotionally and socially together.

**Responsible To:** Directly reports to the Montlure Camp Director; Ultimately accountable to the council of the Montlure Presbyterian Properties, Inc.

### Responsibilities:

1. Lead campers in meaningful ways through music and liturgy
2. Work to achieve the program goals of the Montlure Camp Director that coordinate themes and Scripture of curriculum
3. Collaborate and communicate with the Chaplain for the week as well as other staff members involved in helping with worship. In conjunction with the the Chaplain, create clear vision for worship each time
4. Help create a real sense of Christian community through the direction of music in worship and in communal Christian living
5. Cultivate a safe environment at all times for campers and staff to explore their faith
6. Be a team player and pitch in with enthusiasm to do whatever task needs to be done
7. Follow Montlure Policies and Procedures at all times
8. Be a positive Christian role model who each camper can respect and look to for support, understanding, and care

### Minimum Qualifications:

- Play an instrument that is helpful in leading music for the duration of camp week
- Possess a growing, searching, tolerant Christian faith that guides one's daily life
- Able to work cooperatively with others
- Flexibility and adaptability when necessary
- Previous experience in leading music & worship
- Able to work and live in a rustic camp environment with daily exposure to varying weather conditions
- Possess the visual and auditory skills to identify and respond to environmental and other hazards related to camp activities.
- Be willing to submit to a criminal background check
- 20 years of age or older
